



# 2021 Chief's Regatta SAILING INSTRUCTIONS



## 1 Rules

- 1.1 The regatta is governed by the "rules" as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.

## 2 Notices to competitors

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the Bulletin Board located inside LYC

## 3 Changes in sailing instructions

- 3.1 Any change in the sailing instructions will be posted before the Skippers meeting at 1215 on Saturday May 1<sup>st</sup> 2021.

## 4 Signals made ashore

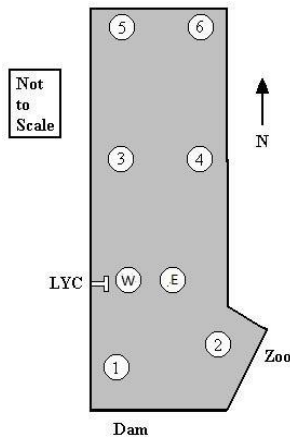
- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the LYC Flagstaff, or from the Race Committee vessel, docked in its usual place at the North Dock, near the LYC Club House. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 15 minutes after the AP is lowered.

## 5 Schedule of races

- 5.1 A total of 5 races will be attempted.  
5.2 The scheduled time for the warning signal for the first race on Saturday May 1<sup>st</sup> 12:45  
5.3 No warning signal will be made after 1730.

## 6 Class flags

- 6.1 The class flag consist of an Interlake insignia on a white background



## 7 Racing area and courses

- 7.1 The racing area will be waters adjacent to LYC on the Scioto River  
7.2 Diagrams of the courses will be shown and explained at the skippers meeting. The diagrams will remain on the

chalkboard for further reference. A schematic diagram showing the approximate area of the marks is shown at left.

- 7.3 The race committee will display number placards showing the course no later than the warning signal. The background color indicates the side on which the mark is rounded: red=port, green=starboard. A "T" indicates the mark is a temporary mark. Temporary marks will be orange inflatable balls. A yellow placard with a circle of arrows and a number indicates the number of times the preceding marks are to be repeated.

## 8 Marks

- 8.1 Marks will consist of orange balls, orange cylinders, and white cylinders.

## 9 The Start

- 9.1 The races will be started using rule 26 with the warning signal five minutes before the starting signal.  
9.2 The starting line will be between an orange flag on the Race Committee vessel and the course side of the port end starting mark.

## 10 Individual recall

- 10.1 Rule 29.1 is modified in that the Race Committee may attempt to notify each boat that is OCS by hailing her sail number. Failure of the RC to hail a boat that is OCS shall not be grounds for redress. Failure of a boat that is OCS to hear a hail, or respond to a hail shall not be grounds for redress.

## 11 The finish

- 11.1 The finishing line will be between orange flag on a Race Committee vessel and the course side of a nearby mark.

## 12 Time limits

- 12.1 The time limit for each race is 90 minutes.  
12.2 Boats failing to finish within 45 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes rules 35 and A4.1.

## 13 Protests and requests for redress

- 13.1 Protest forms are available at the official bulletin board. Protests shall be delivered to a member of the Race Committee within the protest time limit.  
13.2 The protest time limit is 30 minutes after the Race Committee vessel docks after the last race of the day. The protest time limit and a list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. The time and location of protest hearings will be announced at the clubhouse after protest time has ended.

## 14 Scoring

- 14.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.  
14.2 The Low-Point scoring system of Appendix A will be used, except that each boat's worst score will not be excluded. This changes A2.1.
