Chief's Regatta

Leatherlips YC, May 3-4, 2025

Windy and wet were the hallmarks of central Ohio spring this year, and the Chief's Regatta caught the brunt of the weather pattern. A week out, the weather apps and the local TV meteorologists were predicting plenty of rain and wind. As the weather picture tightened up in the mid-week, some prognostications included a near certainty of all-day rain and better than even chances of wind in excess of 20 knots on the water at Leatherlips Yacht Club. No doubt it would discouraged some Interlakers from making the trip to the season opener.

The dull gray Saturday morning revealed a cool north wind, occasional whitecaps rattling the docks, and rain showers drenching the undersized fleet of nine Interlakes assembled in the hoist area. As Jill Savage wrapped up the registrations, J.P. Clowes, the regatta PRO, got together with A.J. Savage, the Fleet 23 Representative, to discuss the conditions. From the shore, it was difficult to assess the breeze and it was decided that somebody should take a boat out on the reservoir to gauge the actual conditions. My brother Doug Savage and I volunteered to be the guinea pigs.

The on-the-water assessment was encouraging. Despite constant rain, we easily sailed up to mark "4," hiking hard only for the occasional puff. At the buoy we turned off the wind, set the spinnaker and broad reached back to the club, just breaking onto a plane in one of the puffs. Back on shore, we reported that the wind seemed to be shifting slightly to the East, keeping the wind and waves manageable for a double-handed boat. Racing was a "go."

J.P. and his RC crew set a course to mark "6" with an offset and a leeward mark right in front of the clubhouse. The plan was to sail all three races for the day back-to-back, so we could get off the water before the expected "worse" weather arrived in late afternoon. Six boats decided to take the plunge.

The races went off without a hitch. Typical of "the Lips," the race features a skewed weather leg with long starboard

tacks and port tacks into the wind-robbing trees on the east side of the reservoir.

In race one, Steve Aspery (1435), Tim Boucher (1291), and A.J. Savage (1293) made solid starts and led the way up to "6." Doug and I were not so quick off the line and split tacks for clear air. When we converged at the top of the course we were back in the hunt. We managed to break into the lead on the second lap, and held on for a 1.

The second race was only one lap. Doug and I rounded the top mark with the pack nipping at our heels and hoping to hold off the wall of boats that kept getting puffs from behind. Except for Aspery getting away, we finished strong with a 2.

Closing out the day, we sailed another two-lap race. The wind shifted a little further east, making a boat speed "horserace" with very few tactical opportunities. We managed to get around the top mark first and drove hard to stay there, collecting another 1.

Saturday concluded with Linda and Mike Mirarchi's (1209) always amazing steak dinner and the camaraderie of grilling meat in the endless drizzle. A brief class meeting chaired by ISCA vice president Tim Cullenen (359) was followed by a rambunctious viewing of the Kentucky Derby.

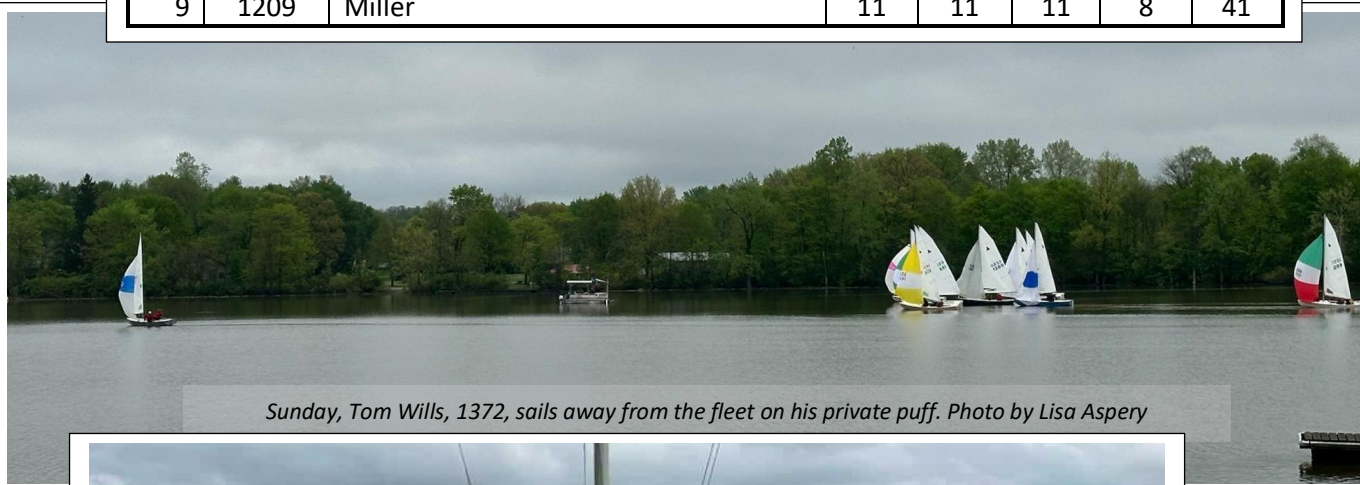
Sunday dawned with less gray, less rain, and a lot less wind. J.P. set a weather mark and offset in the middle of the south end of the reservoir, between "1" and "2" and then used "4" as a leeward mark. The full fleet of nine boats raced, and after all the boats rounded the offset, the wind went full fluky. Boats on the east side were becalmed and sat helplessly as Tom Wills (1372) set a spinnaker and sailed west around the entire fleet in his own private puff. It was maddening to watch as it seemed he was going to make mark "4" unscathed, but never fear, the wind left him stranded a hundred yards short. Doug and I managed to drift our way from the middle of the fleet into the lead, only to place second to Tim Boucher in a photo-finish. After all the boats finished, the water stayed glassy until 11:30, when the last race was cancelled.

As always, the Chief's Regatta delivered a memorable start to the season. It was great to see friends and family, and race with some fantastic sailors. Watching the weather develop over the week, I fretted over what might come, but then I was reminded of something I heard from a crusty Air Force pilot I knew. Jim said, "Never launch or cancel on a forecast," meaning wait and see what the actual conditions are at departure time, and then decide what to do. He was right, and our patience paid off with good racing.

Cattail Regatta

Eleven Interlakes showed up. Then it got sporty. Maumee Bay predicted wind was 14 with gusts to 20, getting lighter in the afternoon. So, the race committee opted to send everyone out to the bay.

The Cattail Regatta is a multi-fleet regatta. Interlakes got the first start followed by the Lasers & then the Catalina 22s. The RC started everyone and things got interesting. Winds were 17 to 27 and increasing. Headed out for the second time around, the weather mark broke away. The race committee saw an impressive multi fleet maneuver as every boat gave chase. Initially the RC wondered what everyone was doing. The RC opted to abandon the race. Everyone was instructed to return to the river and they would attempt to set a course in the river & restart the racing.

The reason for abandoning the race may have been, RC didn't have another anchor to secure the wayward mark or

winds were building rather than diminishing as predicted and there weren't enough support boats to assist if racers started capsizing or something else; the reason was never stated. When the RC returned to the river, they announced it would take about half an hour to reset the course & restart so most competitors opted to tie off at the docks and have a brief shore break.

Three races were sailed in the Ottawa River with its' usual gusty shifty winds, which were also causing the water to get even more shallow than usual. River was estimated to be only four feet deep and sand bars were an unexpected hazard. Many found themselves with the 'parking brake' applied as they found a sandbar, even in the middle of the channel. Races were close and after 3, folks were ready to finish.

Awards were presented, 'small' flags & perpetual trophies and then a grill your own dinner began. Many stayed to enjoy the comradery of the fellow sailors.

Leatherlips Yacht Club

Leatherlips Yacht Club offers three options for youth sailing in Central Ohio. Open to LYC Members and the public are the Sailing School and High School Sailing programs. For LYC Members only the Club offers the opportunity to be part of our Jr Race Team which participates in I-LYA Junior regattas and Jr Bay Week.

Sailing School - The sailing school at Leatherlips offers options for youth and adults who have never stepped foot on a sailboat as well as those who race. The program has been in existence for over 60 years. Classes were held in Penguins initially and the sailing school now has Lasers, Club 420s and Optimists. Our instructors start out as students and eventually show a love of sailing and an interest in instructing. We offer LYC Members and Non-Members the opportunity to instruct.

Jr Race Team - Leatherlips has been fortunate to have youth sailors who have participated in the I-LYA Junior circuit since the 1960's. From early on when the Sear's Cup was the only boat option to today when the sailors have their choice of Opti's, C420s, Lasers and a few Thistle events. The team is currently coached by Members who also participated on the Jr circuit. The team experience ranges from first year racing sailors to third generation sailors.

High School Sailing - Leatherlips was fortunate to get started in the HS program very recently. The first season was 2020. The number of sailors varies depending on the sports schedules of the participants. Some are able to do a little sailing as well as participate in the other high school sports. The sailors practice two days per week but travel to regattas in the Midwest.

Youth Learn to Sail (LTS) was canceled due to constructions hazards but will return in 2026. Adult LTS classes were held as scheduled.

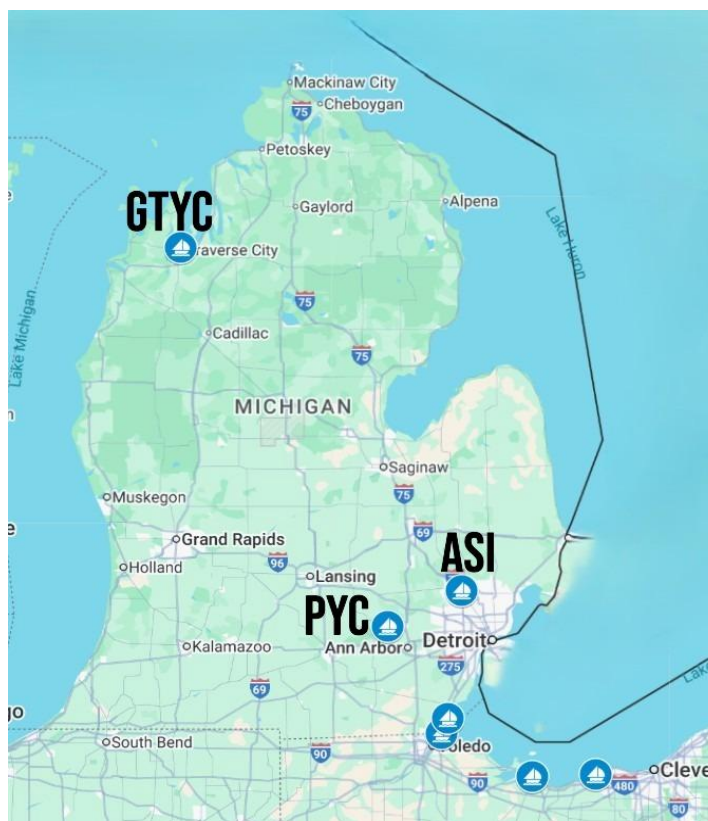

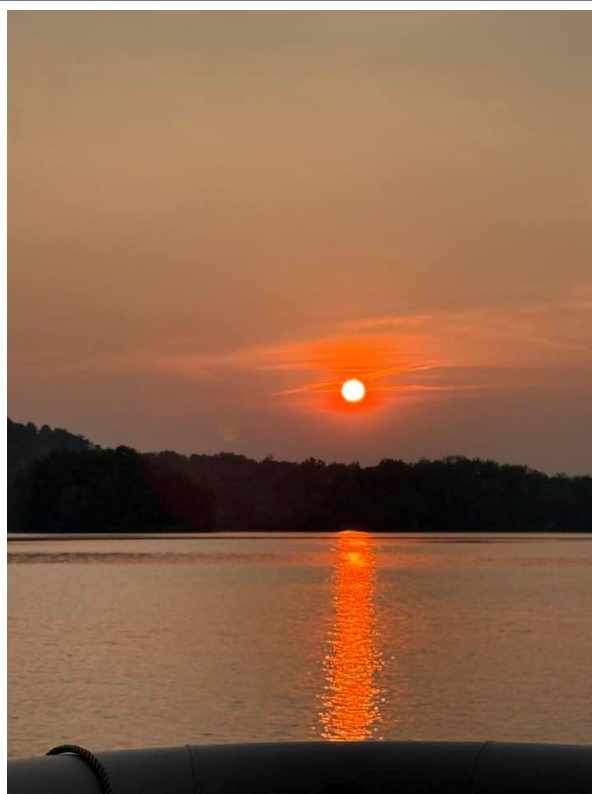

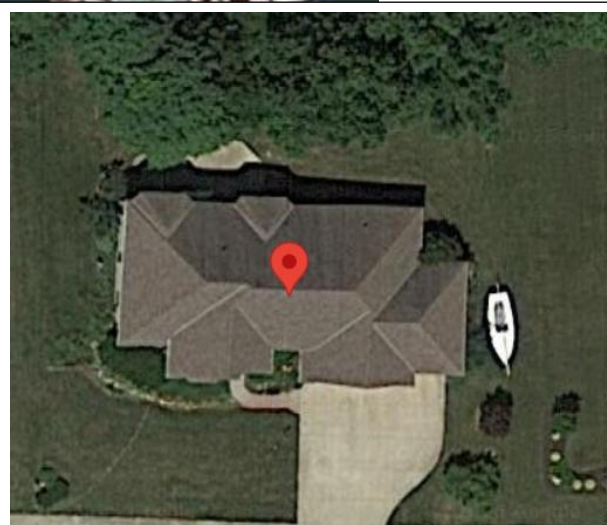

Exciting news along Cleveland's lakefront!

Cleveland Metroparks and partners broke ground on the Patrick S. Parker Community Sailing Center, a state-of-the-art facility designed to provide unprecedented public access to Lake Erie and new sailing education and recreational opportunities on 5-9.

During the groundbreaking ceremony, Cleveland Metroparks unveiled new features of the upcoming project. Two new facilities will comprise the Sailing Center. The east building of the Patrick S. Parker Community Sailing Center will feature two stories of multi-purpose learning spaces, indoor and outdoor community areas, dining, and a marina store. Totalling nearly 24,000 square feet, the education space will house two sailing simulators and indoor waterfront dining to E. 55th Street. Outdoor dining will be available on the first level as well as the Washkewicz Rooftop Terrace. The nearly 4,000 square

foot Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Boathouse, which will sit to the west, will serve as the sailing hub with boat and equipment storage, multipurpose spaces and a covered exterior classroom space. The Sailing Center will be fully accessible, featuring adaptive equipment and wheelchair-accessible amenities, exceeding ADA standards by incorporating universal design principles.

The Sailing Center will host year-round Sailing STEM programming for schools & community partnership organizations under the operation of The Cleveland Foundry at the Charlie Britton Sailing School. The Foundry will also provide Ohio Boating Safety and Education Classes and Water Safety Certifications classes to the community.

The project is expected to be completed in 2026

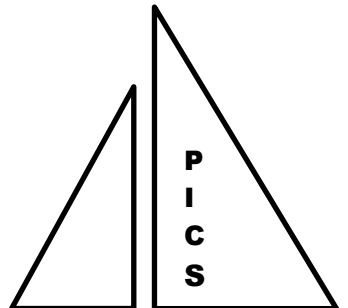
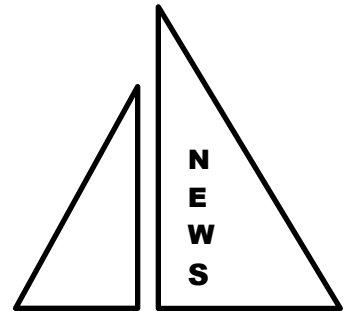

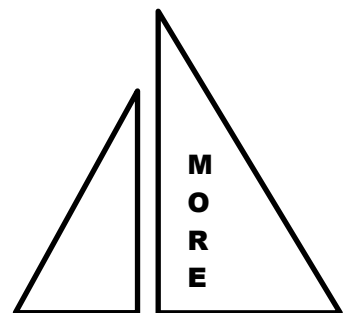
